

# **Troop 680 Cool Weather Personal Camping Gear Checklist**

---

- Lawn chair
- Non-aerosol sunscreen and insect repellent
- Class A uniform – Shirt, shorts or pants, belt, socks
- Adequate layers of clothing, including jacket for the expected temperature, plus one extra dry set of clothes.
- Rain poncho. It ALWAYS rains when you camp.
- Waterproof hiking boots
- Tennis shoes
- Personal mess kit - cup, plate
- Personal knife, fork, spoon
- 1-2 Man Tent if you prefer to use your own rather than the troop tents.
- Sleeping pad
- Sleeping bag
- Extra dry socks
- Plastic dirty/wet clothes bag
- Tooth brush, toothpaste, personal supply of toilet paper
- Chapstick
- Small hand towel
- Wrist watch (wear it)
- Folding pocket knife – no sheath knives
- Flashlight (check those batteries)
- Camera and film
- Cap (baseball or wool stocking)
- Boy Scout Handbook
- Small notebook and pen
- Water bottle (for hiking or when you wake up thirsty in the middle of the night)
- Totin' Chip
- Toasted Chit (if you took pressurized fuel training)
- \$\$\$ - A few dollars for Trading Post
- Common sense
- Sense of adventure

## **Other Things To Remember !**

Scout camping trips are outdoor active events. “Electronics Weekend” camp is the only camp where electronics are allowed. Adult Leaders may use hand held short-range personal communication devices on a limited basis, in order to keep track of scouts in different areas of the camp as necessary.

Personal snacks must be kept in a hard plastic air-tight container. Keep all your empty wrappers in the container as well. This will leave less clean up when we break camp.

Mark all your gear (before you leave home) with a permanent marker.

Make sure your leader knows if you are arriving or leaving at any time other than the published event times.
