Socks <sup>4</sup>	
Hat with a brim (for shade)	
Bandana	
Rain gear	
Extra Underwear (for longer trips)

<sup>4</sup> The quality of the socks cannot be overstated. Bring extra pairs and change them regularly. The socks wick the moisture away from your feet, but need to be changed.
